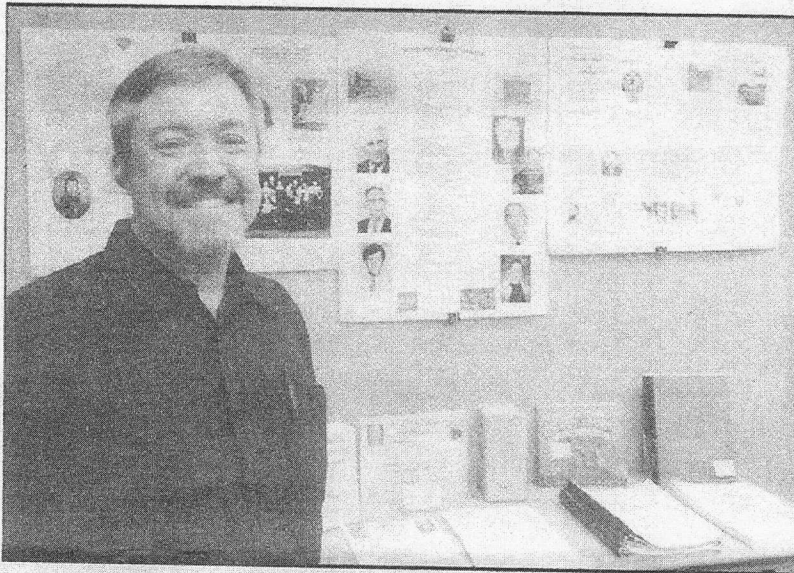

## Constitution history talk at DAR meeting
